#### **Conference Timetable**

### Sale and distribution of material

The CAC does not permit the unauthorised sale or distribution of any material, including leaflets, within the Conference Centre. Stewards have been instructed to ensure that this ruling is strictly enforced.

### **Leaders' Speech**

The Leaders' Speech will begin at 12:15pm. Delegates are required to take their seat in the hall before 11:55am or the seat will be reallocated. Delegates will not require a ticket for the speech, only their Conference pass to enter the hall.

### **Left Luggage**

A left luggage facility is available today between 8am and 5pm for delegates who need to check out of their accommodation this morning. This is located in the Jury's Inn, located opposite the Echo Arena on King's Dock. Luggage cannot be taken into the conference venues.

### **Safe Space**

We have a safe space available in the ECL Atrium which is accessible during conference hours. An accessibility steward is available outside the safe space.

#### **Card Votes**

A card vote is intended to resolve a position where a show of hands is not decisive, to establish the exact breakdown of votes when the majority is of procedural significance (eg two-thirds required) or on a challenge to the Chair. Voting takes place at the end of the session by a show of hands. Where a show of hands is unclear a card vote can be taken having been either requested by delegates or by the decision of the Chair. The decision of the Chair is final.

Constitutional amendments (rule changes) are always decided by a card vote. If a card vote is called the vote is taken immediately so delegates must carry their card vote booklet with them while Conference is in session.

Tellers will pass ballot boxes along each row. Delegates should cast their vote using their card vote booklets by selecting either a FOR or AGAINST card for each vote.

Each card vote in the booklet is numbered. The Chair will announce the number of the card vote being taken.

#### **Ballot and card vote results**

The result of card and ballot votes in which all delegates participate are weighted to give 50% of the total votes cast to CLPs and 50% of the total votes cast to other affiliates. Abstentions are not recorded. The results of card votes will be announced to Conference and published in the CAC reports.

### **Emergency Motion**

#### **Build Our Royal Liverpool Hospital**

Conference notes that on the 17<sup>th</sup> September 2018, the Liverpool Echo reported that the 'longstop date' for the stalled Royal Liverpool Hospital is the September 30, 2018, meaning that the entire hospital construction project could be declared in default, likely to be followed by a complete termination of the current contract.

Conference further notes the reporting on the 12<sup>th</sup> September revealed that some of the cladding installed on the new building did not satisfy fire regulations.

Conference notes that the complex fallout from the insolvency of Carillion PLC could take years to resolve.

Conference states its anger and frustration that Government has left its citizens using facilities that are not fit for purpose for the health requirements of a modern city.

Conference therefore believes that the only remedy that will succeed is:

The Government takes direct control of the project and ensures that the construction of the site is completed as swiftly as possible with the necessary public funding.

The Government ensures that, so far as possible, any losses arising from the collapse of Carillion PLC are born by the private sector (relevant insurers and investors in the project who accepted the commercial risks of the project) and not the public purse.

Finally, Conference welcomes the unified support from the Mayor of Liverpool, Liverpool City Council, unions including UNITE, UNISON and GMB, the city's Members of Parliament, the Metro Mayor, patients groups and local campaigners such as Keep Our NHS Public on this campaign.
