The Labour Party

March 2022

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1. Investigations

1.1. NEC Panels have determined 784 (+148) investigations since 21 May 2020 or 148 (+30) investigations since the last report on 18 January 2022.

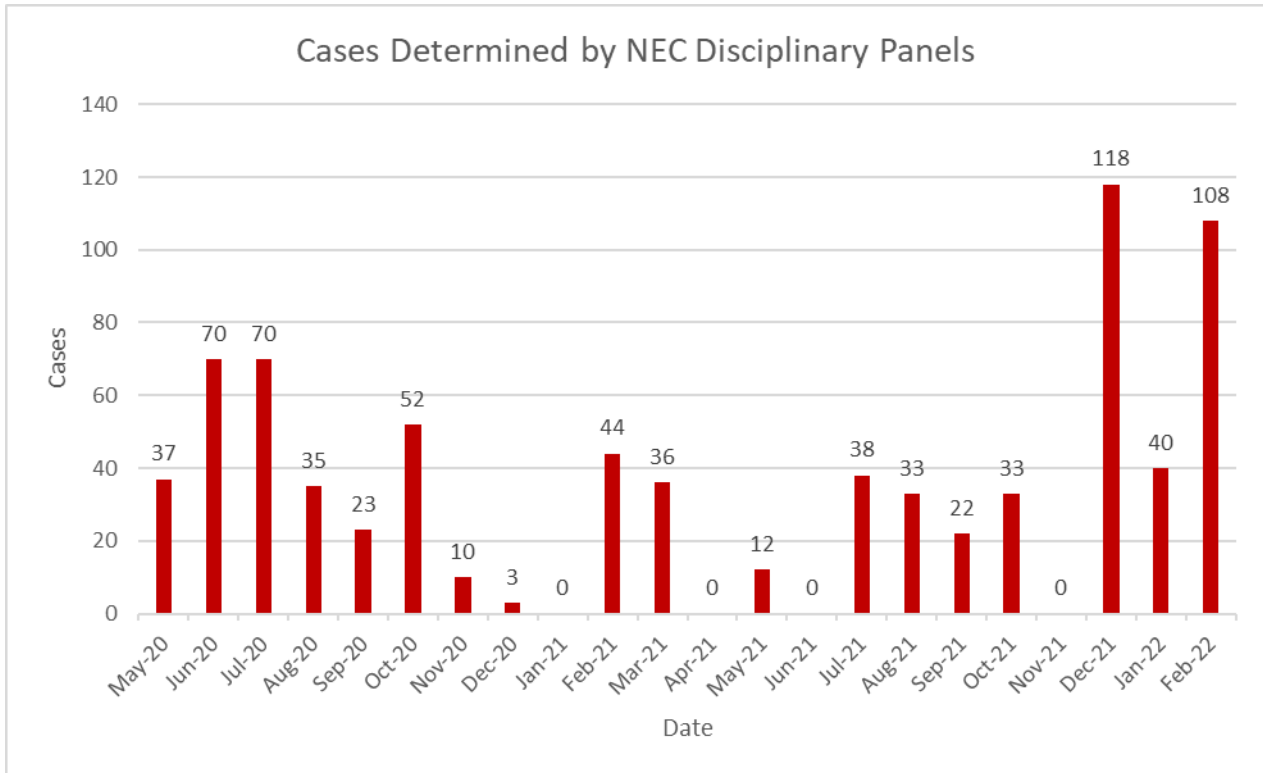


Figure 1: Investigations Determined between 21 May 2020 and 28 February 2022

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Category of Cases

1.2. Of the 636 cases determined by NEC Panels since 21 May 2020: 63.9% (+3.99%) have involved allegations of antisemitism; 7.17% (-1.69%) have involved constitutional matters; 6.38% (-1.01%) have involved bullying, harassment, or intimidation; 5.87% (+0.84%) have involved online conduct (e.g. abusive or unpleasant online conduct); 4.08% (-0.48%) have involved some form of misconduct, typically elected representatives that have been subject to standards investigations or broken Covid restrictions; 3.32% (-0.61%) have involved allegations of Islamophobia; 2.81% (-0.49%) have involved allegations of anti-black racism; 2.30% (-2.83%) have involved allegations of sexism; 1.02% (-0.24%) have involved safeguarding allegations; 1.02% (-0.24%) have involved allegations of sexual harassment.

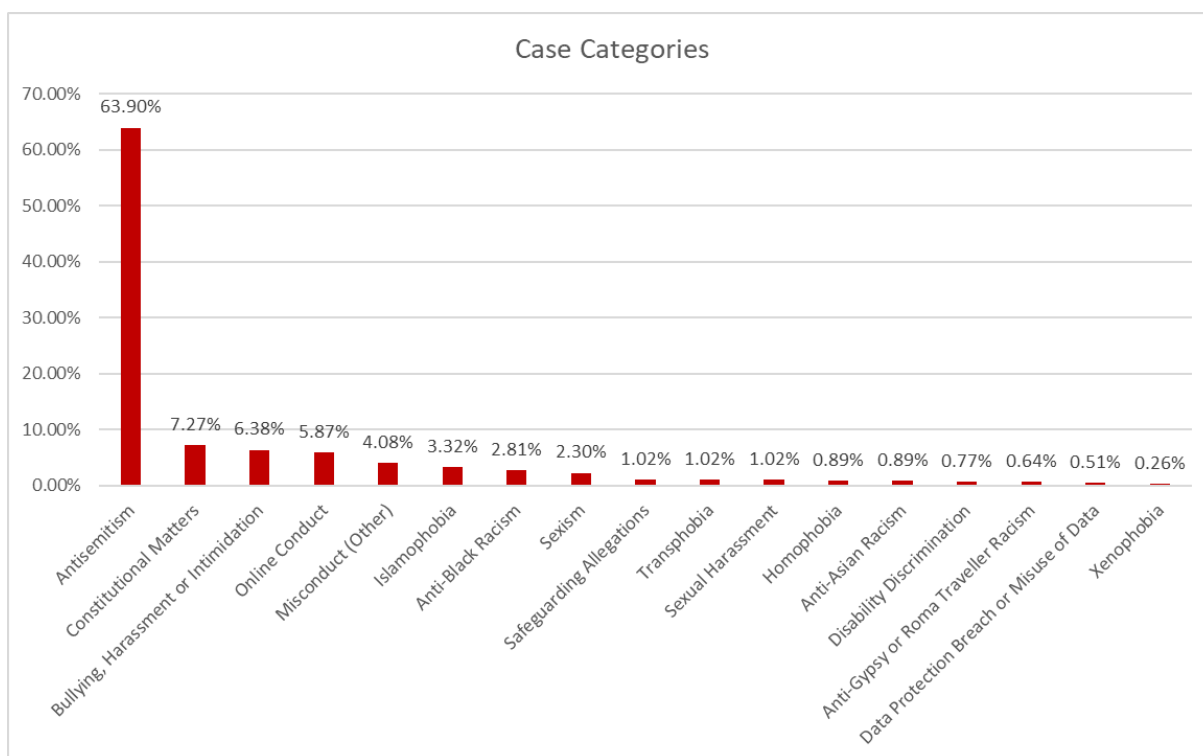


Figure 2: Types of case heard between 21 May 2020 and 28 February 2022

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1.3. Of the 148 cases determined since the last report on 18 January 2022: 81.08% have involved allegations of antisemitism; 9.46% have involved allegations of online conduct (e.g. online abuse); 2.03% have involved allegations of bullying, harassment or intimidation; 2.03% have involved other forms of misconduct; 0.68% have involved allegations of Islamophobia; 0.68% have involved allegations of Afrophobia or Anti-Black racism, 0.68% have involved allegations of Transphobia; 0.68% have involved allegations of Homophobia; 0.68% have involved allegations of Anti-Asian Racism; 0.68% have involved allegations of Disability Discrimination; 0.68% have involved allegations of misconduct in public office; and 0.68% have involved allegations of anti-Catholicism.

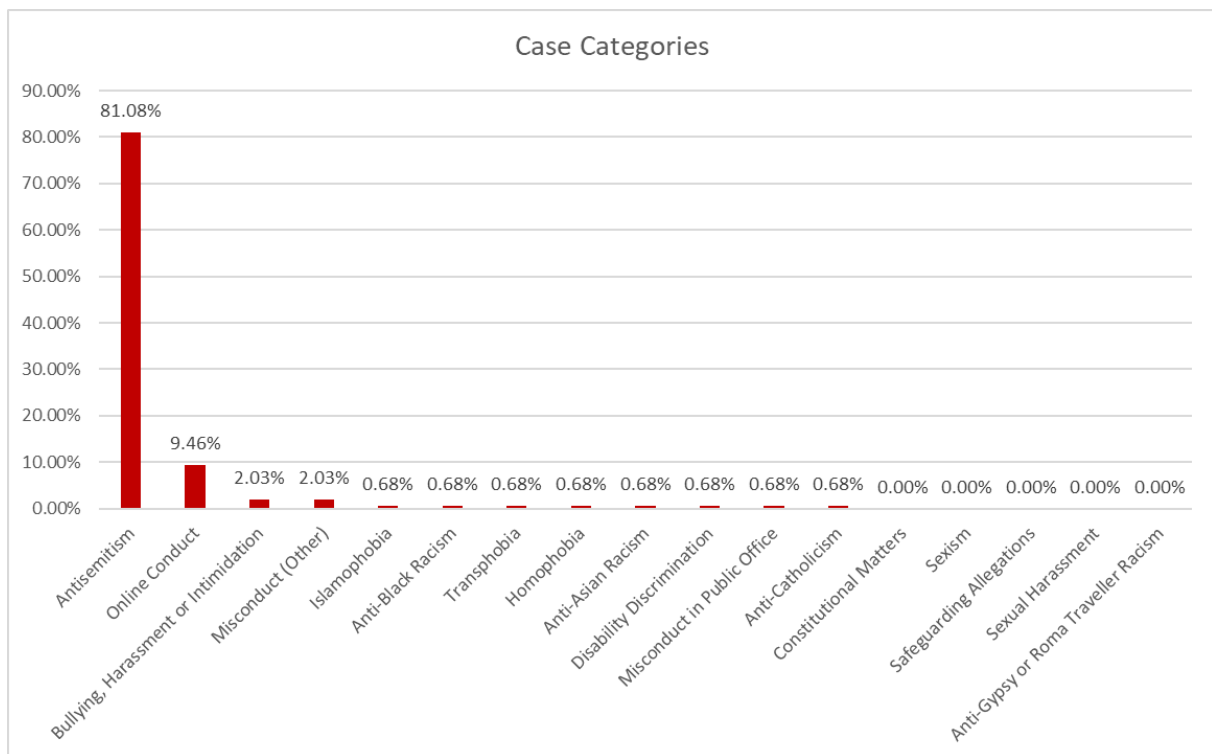


Figure 3: Types of case heard between 18 January 2022 and 28 February 2022

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Disciplinary Outcomes

- 1.4. Of the 636 cases determined by NEC Disputes sub-panels since 21 May 2020: 18.37% have resulted in expulsion; 9.44% have resulted in some form of punitive suspension; 8.55% have been referred to the National Constitutional Committee; 19.77% have resulted in the issuing of an NEC Formal Warning; 17.98% have resulted in the issuing of a Reminder of Conduct; 11.48% have resulted in the issuing of a Reminder of Values; no further action was taken in 14.41% of cases.

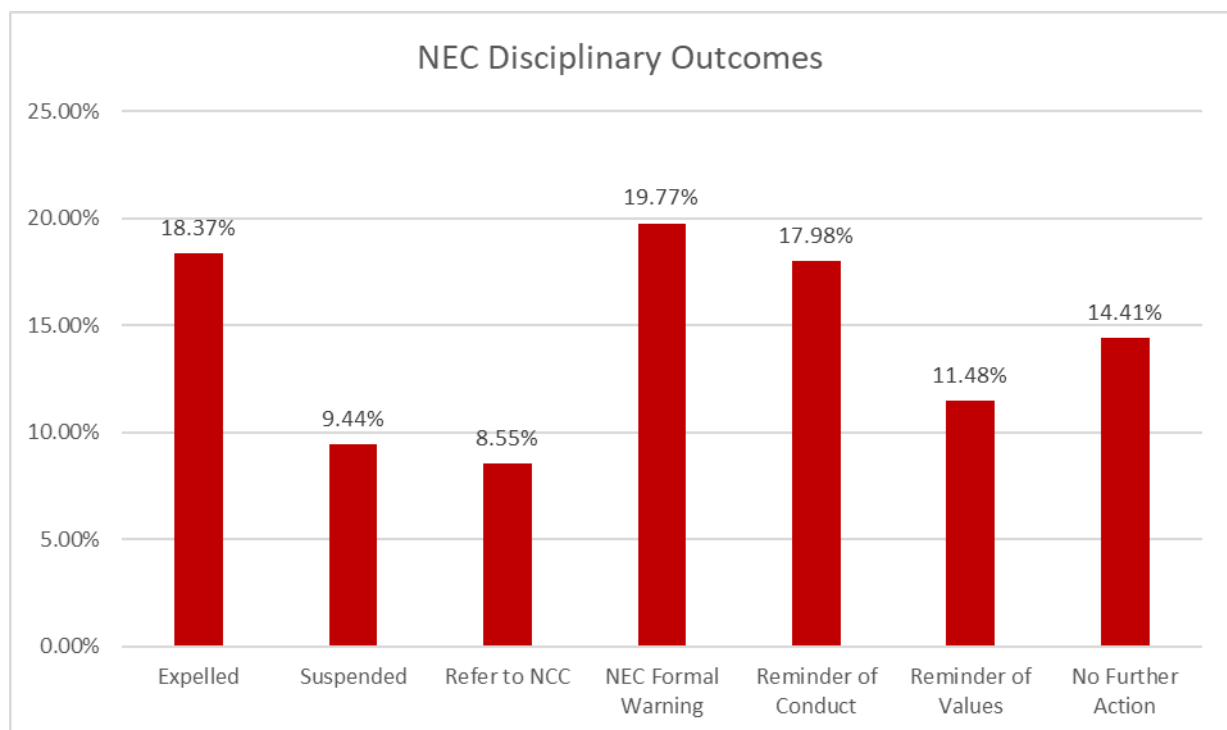


Figure 4: Outcomes between 21 May 2020 and 28 February 2022

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1.5. Of the 148 cases determined by NEC Disputes sub-panels since the last report on 09 November 2021: 11.49% have resulted in expulsion; 9.46% have resulted in some form of punitive suspension; 2.70% have been referred to the National Constitutional Committee; 17.57% have resulted in the issuing of an NEC Formal Warning; 12.84% have resulted in the issuing of a Reminder of Conduct; 24.32% have resulted in the issuing of a Reminder of Values; no further action was taken in 21.62% of cases.

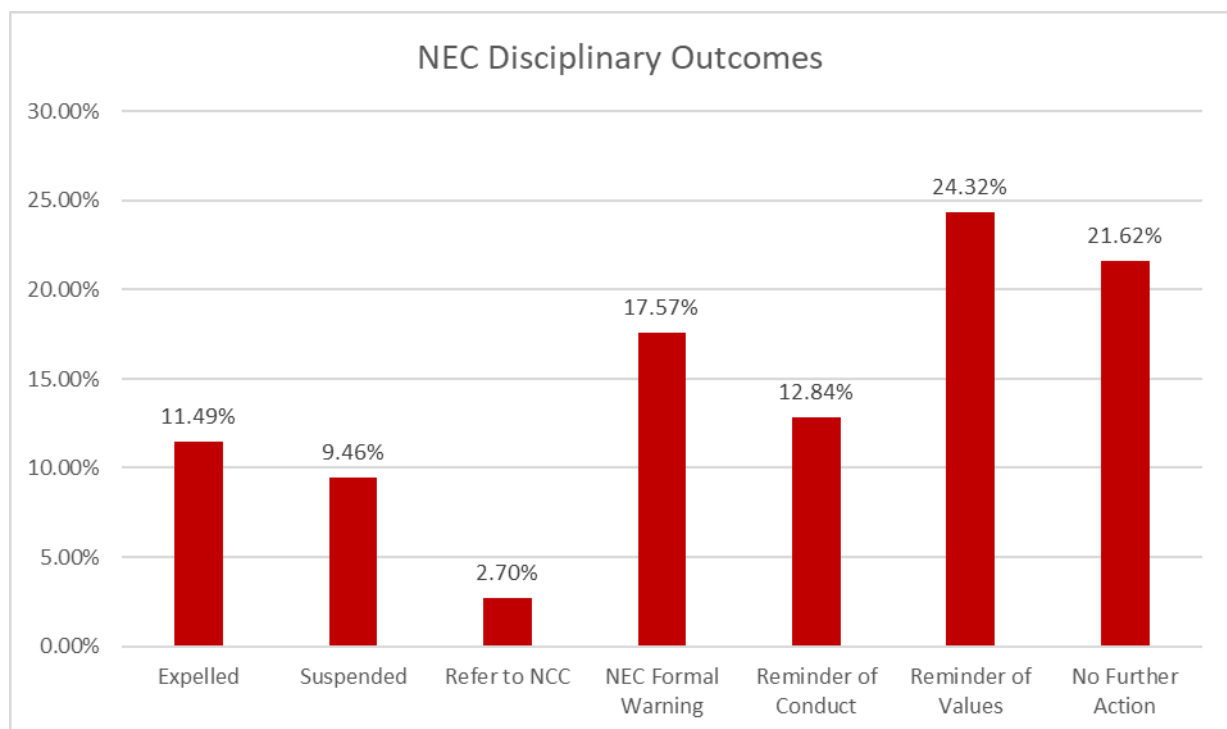


Figure 5: Outcomes between 09 November 2021 and 28 February 2022

2. Exclusions

2.1. Since exclusion panels began on 22 October 2021, 188 (+102 since the previous report) cases have been determined. Of these 188 cases:

2.1.1. 96% of the allegations were upheld and 4% of the allegations were not upheld.

2.1.2. 97% of the cases involved support for another political organisation (Chapter 2, Clause I.5.B.v). 2% involved a member being convicted of a serious criminal offence (Chapter 2, Clause I.5.B.viii). 1 % involved a substantiated safeguarding concern.

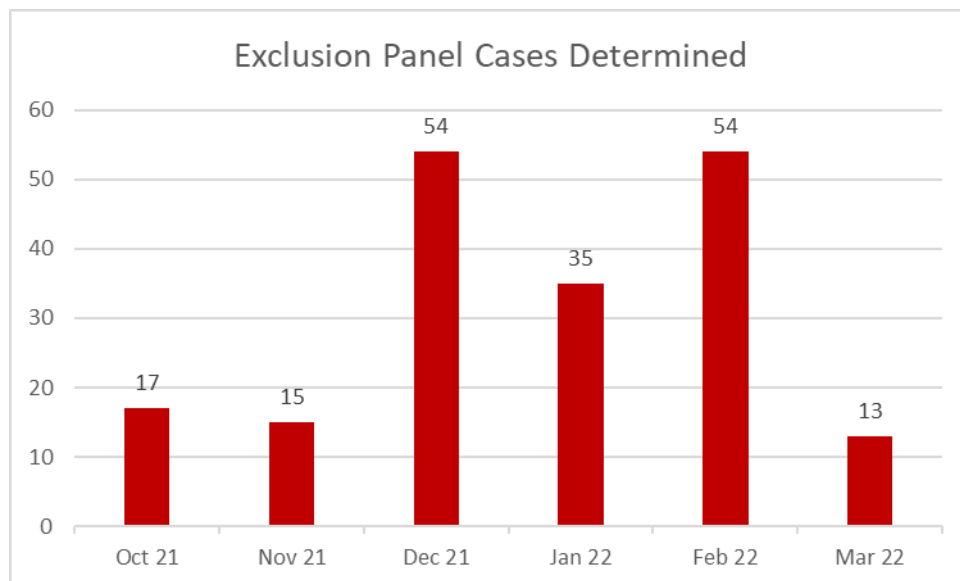


Figure 6: Exclusion cases heard between 22 October 2021 and 01 March 2022

3. Terminations

- 3.1. 12 (+10 since the previous report) people have had their membership terminated pursuant to Chapter 2, Clause I.4 of the Labour Party Rule Book since the previous report on 18 January 2022.

- 3.2. 3 had their membership terminated for standing as candidates against the Labour Party; 4 had their membership terminated for signing nomination papers of other candidates; and 5 people had their membership terminated for declaring their intent to stand as a candidate against the Labour Party.

4. National Constitutional Committee

- 4.1. 107 (+11 since the last report) that have been referred to the National Constitutional Committee have concluded since 10 March 2020. 26% went to a hearing; 41% lapsed before a hearing; 24% resigned before their hearing; and 9% were expelled or excluded for unrelated disciplinary offences.

- 4.2. There are 79 (-1) cases currently awaiting a hearing of the National Constitutional Committee. 23 (+19) of these have papers served and are currently awaiting a hearing. The papers for the rest of these cases are currently being worked on by officers.
