2. Disciplinary Cases

- 2.1 To date in 2026, panels of the National Executive Committee (NEC Panels) considered 6 cases investigated under Chapter 6, Clause I of the Labour Party Rule Book.
- 2.2 There is an NEC Panel scheduled for 25 February 2026 to consider cases investigated under Chapter 6, Clause I of the Labour Party Rule Book.



Case Categories

- 2.3 Figure 7 shows that, in 2026, 50% of cases have involved bullying, harassment or intimidation, with 12.5% involving racism (other), Afrophobia or Anti-Black racism, sexism, and misconduct (other).



2.4 These figures represent the proportion of total cases in which each category of allegation appears. For example, if there were only one case, and it involved allegations of both antisemitism and Islamophobia, then both categories would be recorded as accounting for 100% of cases.

Case outcomes

2.5 Figure 8 shows that the most common outcome in 2026 has been the issuing of a Formal Warning by the NEC, accounting for 50% of cases.

2.6 Referrals to disciplinary bodies made up 50% of outcomes, with 33% referred to the National Constitutional Committee (NCC) and 17% to the Independent Complaints Board (ICB).



3. Independent Review Board

3.1 Between January and February 2026, the IRB reviewed a total of 3 cases. All cases were verified. There are no cases awaiting verification.

4. Exclusion Panels

4.1 Figure 9 shows that, between October and December 2025, the NEC considered a total of 9 cases under Chapter 2, Clause 1.5 of the Rule Book. Of these 9 cases, 6 (66%) were upheld and 3 (33%) were not upheld.



5. Terminations

- 5.1 Between January and February 2026, 4 members had their membership rights terminated pursuant to Chapter 2, Clause I.4 of the Labour Party Rule Book.
- 5.2 Of these 4 members, the membership rights of 3 individuals were terminated for publicly declaring their intention to stand in an election against the Labour Party; the membership rights of 1 individual was terminated for standing against the Labour Party in a public election.

6. Disciplinary Appeals

- 6.1 No disciplinary appeals have been heard in this reporting period.
- 6.2 A total of 5 disciplinary appeals are outstanding and are scheduled to be undertaken in March 2026.

7. NCC

- 7.1 The National Constitutional Committee (NCC) has not heard any cases to date in 2026.
- 7.2 1 member lapsed from the Party before their case could be considered.
- 7.3 Paperwork is being prepared by staff for 2 further cases, paperwork for 2 cases are awaiting review, and paperwork for 11 cases has been prepared and submitted to the NCC Secretary.

8. ICB

- 8.1 In 2026 to date, the Independent Complaints Board (ICB) has heard 2 cases. These comprised of two 'not proven' outcomes.
- 8.2 Additionally, 1 case has concluded because the member resigned.
- 8.3 Paperwork for one case is awaiting review, and paperwork for 1 case has been prepared and submitted to the ICB Secretary.
